







- 1: Behold it in "No"
- 2: Write the name of your tournament
- 3: It's probably just yourself
- 4: Write your name if you want to, or leave it blank

- 5: Start and end date of your tournament
- 6: Select the type of Blood Bowl being played; "normal" Blood Bowl is played as "Blood Bowl 2020"
- 7: Link to your Facebook event; remember your event must be public, open for everyone to see.
- 8: Address and further details about the venue

- 9: Here, you simply copy and paste the detailed description you have in your Facebook event regarding your rules. Please remember to write at the end that Further updates will be posted on Facebook.
- It's also good practice for everything here to be in English.






Open the program



- 1: Write the name of your tournament.
- 2: Don't touch
- 3: Here you write the number of participants; this provides more lines on the "front" so set this number a little to high.
- 4: Don't touch

- 5: Don't touch
- 6: Here you choose whether it's an individual tournament or a group tournament like Eurobowl.
- 7: Don't touch
- 8: Here you choose what should be visible, just have them as I have them here.

- 9: Check that off, not everyone likes to have their real name out there.
- 10: Here you choose how many points you get for a win, etc.
- 11: Here you choose which tiebreakers the tournament plays by; they can vary slightly depending on your stance or if the tournament follows a theme, but "Total Score" is always number 1.





AND YOU'RE BOUND TO FUCK UP so backups are nice.

- 1: Miscellaneous items used for one's event.
- 2: All submitted rosters
- 3: The folder with the Score program
- 4: The folder with the Score save files
- 5: Shortcut from the Score folder for easy access
- 6: This is your master file; it contains nothing but what you've organized under "options" and "Settings," and you've entered coach data, so you're all set to start your tournament when you open this file.
- 7: Now you've started round 1 and clicked the "New Round" button to get a draw, you save that file, and you do that every time you press that button.
- 8: Now that the round is over and you've entered all the results, you save the file before clicking on "New Round."
- 9: Here's your final file when all rounds have been played; you also need this file if your tournament is part of the Danish Masters series.
- 10: Here's your final file that you can get out of the program under "File" and "Create NAF upload file"; this is needed to register the matches with NAF under the event you've created there, to finally conclude your tournament.

At the bottom of your score file, you have these; you can use them along the way to see Results or Draw in a (perhaps a bit fancier) different way.



Here you get a nice display of the draw. It opens in your internet browser.





You have your .xml file from the score program and just need to have it placed in the right location, so you're almost there:)






"Now we have the trouble. Either it doesn't come up with any error message, and everything is fine because you've just got everything under control that you entered.

If you go back to 'Report results' for your tournament where you've just been, it looks something like this instead; there are a bunch of names of those who participated in your event.


But unfortunately, it rarely goes like that."




Instead, what probably happens is:


That you receive a bunch of errors regarding some coach NAF numbers and Coach NAF names not matching up. Remember, there shouldn't be any spaces after numbers/names, and it's also important whether it's uppercase or lowercase.

Now that it has given you a list of those with errors, use it. Open a new internet window and your score file in the program so you're ready to edit.
