

NAF Tournament Data Review of 2024

This report looks at the data held in the NAF database of tournament games, so will not reflect league games or non-NAF tournament games.

Number of Games

2024 passed the number of games in 2023, even with the 10,000 games over 3 days in Alicante, as 2300 coaches attended the 5th NAF World Cup. The largest Blood Bowl gathering of the year was in Athens for the Eurobowl and Europen, and there were almost 8000 unique NAF players over the year, 1000 more than in 2023.




Figure 1 - Number of Games from all variants

Large Tournaments


There were 24 tournaments around the world with 100 or more participants, including the Majors in the UK, America, Sweden, Wales, Spain and France and huge team tournaments such as Bilbali, UKTC, Tilea and the Amorical Cup. Some of these large tournaments have reached their 20th occurrence, showing the maturity of the global tournament scene, but they are also joined by newcomers such as the Kent Team Championship.

Variants

The most popular variant of tabletop BB continues to be 7s, but people hit the beach in decent numbers for the first time. Specialist variant games stayed around the same, and Gutterbowl and Streetbowl continued to be niche pursuits.






Figure 3 - Success and Popularity

The graph above shows the win percentage and the number of games played for each race, showing the continuing popularity of Orcs and the success of Underworld, carrying on from 2023. Amazons and Wood Elves. The Greek Eurobowl ruleset was used quite extensively throughout the year, and the tiered cash meant that necro, vamps and wood elves got a bit of a boost in the ruleset and thus the win rates. Will be interesting to see the Hungary effect in 2025, particularly on some of the teams that are designed to have to make harder choices, such as Dark Elves.



The full year is only half the story, though, as it was a year of two halves for Underworld following their nerf at the end of the May, as swarming became less effective. The chart on the right show January to May, then June to December is below. You can see from this that pre-nerf Underworld were nudging 60% and in the top 10 most popular teams, then post-nerf this dropped to 53% and were in the bottom 5 in terms of popularity.

The second half of the year saw Wood Elves and Vampires join Amazons at the top of the tree, and it will be interesting to see if a Vampire nerf is forthcoming in the next Designers Commentary, if such things still exist (or is there a new edition coming...?)




Figure 5 – Success and Popularity June – Dec 2024




Figure 4 - Success and Popularity Jan - May 2024

Gnomes joined the fun properly in the second half of the year, and there is some debate as to whether they should be seen as a stunty team, though their win rate certainly suggests they are a challenge to play. Goblins had a triumph of sorts by nudging their win rate over 40% in the second half of the year – take the wins where you can get them!

Chaos Dwarves are perceived to have been nerfed late in 2024, though probably too late to account for their win rate dropping from 52% to 48%. Will they be able to breathe fire into their 2024 rating, or is that too bullish an outlook?



Prolific Coaches

Volkajo's 176 games in 2023 looked unassailable, but that was ill-judged as Torquemada made a strong start to the year then set his eyes on the prize, finishing on a huge 183 games from 41 tournaments, also smashing the record for the most tournaments in a year. He also played 21 different races in this year, so is not just a Vampire specialist!

To look at growth internationally I've looked at the number of unique players in each year, which is the number of coaches from a nation that player in a tournament in a particular year, and it was impressive that Spain grew from 2023 after hosting the World Cup – great to see that it seems the game has had a big boost following that hugely successful event! Cyprus snuck in with 11 registered players after appearing in the Eurobowl for the first time – hopefully they will make it to Hungary as well!

There was big growth in unique players in almost all the big countries, with only Denmark among the top 20 not growing their player base. Ukraine now has a huge 19 NAF coaches after putting on a tournament in Kiev under challenging circumstances – much respect!

You can also see below the number of tournaments that took place in each country – the first ones in China, Cyprus, Ukraine and Luxembourg!

Looking Forward

The big event of 2025 is the Eurobowl and Europen in Hungary in October, with many tournaments throughout the year using what has been a hotly debated ruleset – you can find a full list on <u>Tableau</u>, based on using #euro25 in the tournament description on the NAF site. We are also looking forward to the announcement of the location for the 2027 World Cup, with four locations bidding; USA, France, Malta and New Zealand. Rumours continue to swirl about a new box set, but the author knows as little as anyone reading this about that!

Tourplay continues to grow and is probably now equal with Score as the default tournament software, though is obviously still internet reliant, so depends on the venue. BBTM was used at the Amorical Cup, and is mentioned as the software for use at some of the World Cup bids, along with the software from the last World Cup. Lots of options for TOs to use!
